March Reports Due by 31st (ctrl and click on name of report)

Child/Youth Protection Policy adoption – Review & renew annually. Mail a signed copy of the Annual Review & Renewal Signature page of the Child/Youth Protection Policy to the district office by March 31st. (Should the policy undergo major revisions, mail a complete copy to the district office).

NOTE: The Child/Youth Protection Policy Template was revised in December 2009. Changes include the addition of information related to online safety, clergy confidentiality, and reporting requirements as well as other revisions. We recommend you review the entire policy template.

Fiscal Responsibility and Management Policy: Financial Controls, Policies, and Procedures - Review & renew annually. Once in compliance, mail a signed copy of the one page Annual Review and Renewal Document to the district office by March 31st.

Sexual Harassment Policy adoption– Review & renew annually. Mail a signed copy of the Annual Review/ Endorsement Renewal to the District Office by March 31st. (Should the policy undergo major revisions, mail a complete and signed copy to the district office).

Disaster Recovery Quick Resource Survey - Survey available via the Church Login on the Conference website. (You will need your Church's user name and password to access Disaster Survey. Contact your District Office if you need assistance.)

Annual Report of the Parsonage

Checklist – Review & renew annually. Mail a signed copy of the Annual Parsonage Review to the District Office by March 31st.

Annual Finance Report - New online report available on Florida Conference website via your church login in 2011. Finance Chairs will

be notified of the new form from their District Office in March.

Lilly Endowment Announces 2011 National Clergy Renewal Program

Lilly Endowment seeks to strengthen Christian congregations by providing an opportunity for pastors to step away briefly from the persistent obligations of daily parish life and to engage in a period of renewal and reflection. Renewal periods are not vacations, but times for intentional exploration and reflection, for drinking again from God's life-giving waters, for regaining enthusiasm and creativity for ministry. In the 2011 National Clergy Renewal Program, the Endowment anticipates awarding as many as 150 grants of up to \$50,000 each directly to Christian congregations for the support of a renewal program for their pastor. Up to \$15,000 of the grant may be used for congregational expenses associated with the renewal program. **Deadline for submission of proposals is May 12, 2011.** Notification of grant awards will be made in September 2011. <http://www.clergyrenewal.org/>

The Foundation will host its second annual "**Clergy Guide to Personal and Church Finance**" May 4-6 at the Hawthorn Suites Hotel, 7450 Augusta National Drive, Orlando. The intensive three-day workshop will focus on the major financial challenges facing clergy as they manage their own budgets and that of a church.

The workshop lays out a foundation for personal and church finance, including how to develop a theology of money. Topics covered include fundamentals of finance and financial planning, church finance, stewardship and the cultural challenges facing clergy and the church. Workshop leaders include Foundation and Conference staff and lay business professionals with wide-ranging expertise on financial matters. Continuing Education credits are offered.

Because many personal financial decisions are family matters, clergy are encouraged to bring spouses to the seminar. Cost is \$195 for couples and \$125 for singles. Tuition covers overnight accommodations, workshop sessions and materials and most meals. Under special circumstances, scholarships are available.

The Office of Camps and Retreat Ministries are seeking 40 outstanding young adults for a powerful summer experience of service and spiritual renewal...and we need your help.

The Florida Conference Summer Mission Intern Program is in its fourth summer in 2011 and will place 40 college students/young adults (ages 19-28) in United Methodist summer outreach day camp settings in 12 communities throughout Florida. The ten week experience involves hands on work with children in local neighborhoods, vocational and spiritual guidance, training, and a support community. Each intern receives a \$2000 stipend, the cost shared 50-50 with the placement agency and the conference.

This program has grown from 4 in 2008 to 13 in 2009 to 26 last year. “FREE” SUMMER CAMP SCHOLARSHIPS OFFERED TO CHURCHES
(WHO HAVE NOT SENT CAMPER IN OVER TWO YEARS)

The Florida Conference Board of Camps and Retreat Ministries is excited to invite you to send children, youth or even grandparents to camp this summer on us! We greatly appreciate your church's connectional ministry giving, and this is one way to receive it back in ways that will bless the children and youth in your neighborhood and/or congregation for years to come. The first 100 requests we receive from the pastors of churches in the Florida Conference who have not sent a child or youth to summer camp in the past two years will receive \$400 to send one or more campers this coming summer. (This is \$400 per church.) If you are receiving this e-mail or letter, you are one of these pastors.

Here's how it works:

- 1 – You or someone on your staff nominates a worthy camper or campers for this summer from your congregation or neighborhood to send to one of our events listed below. *Note: It is recommended that sending more than one camper helps with the “first-time” experience, to have a friend to share it with.*
- 2 – You then help them fill out a registration form which can be found at www.flumcamps.org for the correct location – Warren Willis Camp, the Life Enrichment Center or Riverside Retreat. Send the registration form in via internet or mail with a note that you are requesting the “Free Scholarship Offer”.
- 3 – Once we receive the application with the deposit, we will send to the church \$400 to apply to the remaining balance on the camper or campers' registration. The money will be sent to the church; you or your staff should make sure that it goes to help the camper or campers complete the payment of fees for this summer.
- 4 – The camper or campers enjoy the summer experience that changes lives! They return to church and share their story, encouraging more children or youth to attend camp next year!
